



# SNOW ROLLER BARN AND MUSEUM

The Peacham Snow Roller Barn is the only known Vermont barn still in existence built for the purpose of storing snow rollers in spring, summer, and fall. In the winter, teams of horses or oxen pulled snow rollers. The rollers were used on the roads to pack the snow.

The barn is a post and beam structure built about 1900.

Today the restored building is a museum full of Vermont snow rollers of different sizes and types for folks to observe.



The Snow Roller Barn and Museum is open during Peacham's Winter Carnival, July 4th Celebration, Fall Foliage Days and other times by arrangement.

The Snow Roller Barn and Museum is located in Peacham, at the top of the hill, behind the monuments. It is situated with a beautiful view at the beginning of the Peacham Town Walking Trail. It can be found down a short unpaved road to the right of the Peacham monuments.
